The Short-Term Goal: An attractive and sustainable House ready for our 150th anniversary!

Why Repairing the House is Important

- Fixing the House has been a Housing Corporation priority for several years now
- Our 122+ year old home is tired and needs a lot of work
- The University granted us a 30-year lease extension to 2054.
- Beta is well-liked by the University, we're on Campus, but the House in current condition needs some TLC
- Convincing actives to live in the House can be a challenge due to current conditions
- We're generally cheaper than dorms and apartments... But not as attractive



- To address the challenge, The Housing Corporation retained the services of Criterium Engineers in 2022 and Sheridan Construction in 2023 to provide Capital Expenditure Estimates for needed improvement

An extensive engineering analysis/report was performed in 2022; a summary of required and prioritized repairs/upgrades prepared; some initial "band-aid" remedies initiated. We are at the point of requiring significant financial support now however, to make this goal happen within a 2-3-year window of renovations. The attached brochure provides additional detail on what we're looking to accomplish, from an infrastructure as well as financial support perspective. Please take a moment to review.
